(2<sup>nd</sup> Corinthians 4:17)

The plea was plainspoken: "Fear none.. be faithful."

(Psalm 30:5) (Matthew 10:28)

<sup>&</sup>quot;Bring them forth. I would change my mind if it meant going from the worse to the better, but not to change from the right to the wrong."

<sup>&</sup>quot;You threaten fire that burns for an hour and is over. But the judgment on the ungodly is forever."

<sup>&</sup>quot;Father, I bless you that you have deemed me worthy of this day and hour, that I might take a portion of the martyrs in the cup of Christ. . . Among these may I today be welcome before thy face as a rich and acceptable sacrifice."
